In 1999, Jeff Kepner had to have a quadruple amputation after fighting strep infection. The 57-year-old underwent the first double hand transplant in the United States at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Centre.

The Christian church is just like the human body in that it can live after several amputations but it certainly won't live up to its full potential if members of the body have been cut off.

You are necessary no matter what part of the body of Christ you are. We need each other, are dependent upon one another and should love each other. In order to enjoy fulfilment as Christians and to fulfil the gospel commission of taking the gospel to the whole world we must learn to love each other and to be unified just like the human body is united and works together.

In my sermon today I will challenge you to fully unite with the body of Christ not only in word but in deed.
